The 2024 Mileage Club takes place from March 25-May 17. Our HSAP has been given special permission for our parents to record the mileage covered *via walking, jogging and/or running*.

Please note that they can no longer accept donations of bottled water or bulk size items. Below is their advertised list of "**most needed**" **items**, but other pantry items are also appreciated:

- Canned fruit
- Cereal
- Pasta sauce
- Peanut butter
- Canned beans or meat
- Rice
- Cooking/baking supplies (spices, oils, mixes, etc)
- Instant items (mashed potatoes, dried milk, etc)
- Diapers (need large sizes)
- Paper products (toilet paper, tissues, napkins, paper towels)
- Baby wipes
- Soaps (bar, hand, dish detergent, laundry)

Stock the IA Snack Room 2024

Snacks are a big part of crafting a low-stress and fun experience for students taking a break during the lowa Assessments in the Harvest Vineyard site. We invite all families who are interested to help us "*stock the Snack Room.*" If you are interested in providing a food item that will be shared with all of our test-takers during the breaks, please bring in those snacks on your student's first test session time.

Please note: All food items in the building must be completely nut-free. Please check labels carefully. We will not be able to include any items manufactured on equipment that has also been used for nut or peanut-products,

A Few Hints:

- Prepare your treats in snack-size bags (for example 2-3 small nut-free cookies, carrot sticks, raisins, pretzels, small bunch of washed grapes)
- Please stay away from "messy foods" or those that may stain fingers (no Doritos, Cheetos, certain Pringles, etc)
- Provide a gluten-free option (label if not easily distinguishable)

Popular items:

- Gummy bears, Twizzlers (pull & peel or regular), fruit snacks
- Washed grapes, individual fruit cups, carrot sticks, clementines, bananas, apples
- Unbuttered popcorn, pretzels, Pringles (non-staining), Goldfish (non-staining)
- Oreos, nut-free granola bars, crackers, rice krispie squares (*note:* if using a generic brand, please check that nut-products were not manufactured on equipment)
- String cheese, meats-sticks (can be cut into ¹/₂ or ¹/₃),
- Homemade nut-free cookies or bars

Please remind your child of any dietary restrictions. The snack room is a very busy and popular place during the breaks, and *one-on-one supervision of each child is not possible.*
