# <u>Learn More About Transferring College</u> <u>Credits Earned While in High School</u>

Transferring college credits earned in high school can seem overwhelming, be confusing, and can vary from each institution. This virtual presentation on Thursday, April 13, will take place from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Discussion will include both completing a degree at DMACC before transferring to a 4-year

institution and transferring college credit directly to a 4-year institution after high school, as well as questions regarding pass/fail, etc. Students will have the opportunity to hear from DMACC, a representative from the lowa Regents and a representative from lowa private colleges via Zoom to virtually discuss frequently asked questions about transferring DMACC credit and what they should be asking colleges about the process.

# 2023 Mary Greeley Mileage Club

Mileage Club has already started, but all interested K-8 students are still welcome to join us! The goal of this eight (8) week program is to encourage students to increase activity levels. *Participation is voluntary.* 

The 2023 Mileage Club takes place from March 20 until Friday, May 12. Our HSAP has been given special permission for our parents to record the mileage covered *via walking, jogging and/or running*. If you know that you would like to have any of your K-8 students participate in this program, please email Kathy Burns, our Mileage Club Coordinator (kathy.burns@ames.k12.ia.us). Provide her with the names and grade levels of all who are interested.

We will follow the same protocol as the Story County schools that participate: Mileage is recorded based on a maximum of three 25 minute exercise sessions per week (or a total of 75 minutes). Small awards are earned every five miles, ranging from a "toe token" to a nice Mileage Club dry-fit tee shirt (at the 25 mile mark).
