<u>Happening Now!</u> Important Information for Parents of 9th-11th Grade Students

This information is also available in an email sent on November 30th by our HSAP staff member/ AHS Liaison, Sonia Harold.

All students, regardless of enrollment plans, are encouraged to complete a high school course plan; this includes students who plan on fully homeschooling for the high school years. Doing so ensures that proper prerequisites and adequate time are accounted for in order for your student to reach his/her goals. Your student may have completed a 4-year plan as an 8th grade student. Our Scripps National Spelling Bee "School Bee" will be on Thursday, January 18, 2024 at 6:30 p.m at Harvest Vineyard (320 S. 17th St., Ames). It will consist of two smaller bees: the first for K - 3rd grade students and the second for 4th - 8th graders. Each bee will begin with several practice rounds in which no one is eliminated, to allow students to get comfortable with the process and to practice speaking out loudly and clearly. *All participants will get to choose a free Scholastic book*. The winner of the K-3 Bee may choose to participate in the 4th-8th Bee, and the winner of the 4th-8th Bee will be eligible to go on to the next level - an online test that can qualify them for the regional meet, which will be held via Zoom.
