<u>Iowa Assessments Sign-up</u>

Iowa Assessments (IA) are available and completely optional for students in grades 3-12 in our Ames HSAP program. These tests are free of charge. Testing will be available remotely and on-site at Harvest Vineyard (320 S. 17th St.) during the first two weeks of May. Both testing location options use online tests (not paper and pencil).

2023 Mary Greeley Mileage Club

This is the eighth year that our Ames HSAP has joined other local Story County schools to participate in the Mary Greeley Mileage Club. The goal of this eight (8) week program is to encourage students to increase activity levels. *Participation is voluntary and is open to those HSAP students who are in Kindergarten through 8th grade.*

The 2023 Mileage Club will take place from March 20-May 12. We have been given special permission for our parents to record the mileage covered via walking, jogging and/or running. If you know that you would like to have any of your K-8 students participate in this program, please contact Kathy Burns (kathy.burns@ames.k12.ia.us), and provide their names and grade levels.

All families with K-8 students will be sent a detailed email in late February after Kathy Burns attends a meeting at Mary Greeley with all the 2023 Mileage Club updates. In the past eight years we have followed the same protocol as the Story County schools that participate: Mileage is recorded based on a maximum of three 25 minute exercise sessions per week (or a total of 75 minutes). Small awards are earned every five miles, ranging from a "toe token" to a nice Mileage Club t-shirt.

We understand that you may join and then change your mind or adapt your participation based on other activities in your lives at that time. However, Mileage Club director Kathy Burns would love to hear from you *if you are thinking about joining us* so she secures the right amount of prizes.

When Cold Weather Keeps You Indoors

It's important to continue a consistent exercise plan even when the weather is not cooperating! Help your children to develop healthy habits, along with providing a change-of-pace and stress-reducer as you complete your school. Plan together as a family to fit your circumstance. This could include:

Indoor Activity Ideas (continued)

- Jump rope ("pretend jump rope" if you don't have any or it works better for everyone's safety!)
- Set up a dance party with favorite music which has a lively beat
- Blow up one or more balloons, set easy (safe) boundaries and start a "Balloon Bop" Game (a relaxed sort of version of volleyball). Try to set a record for how many in a row. You decide if a child can hit more than once in a row. Change up positions so all have a good opportunity to hit the balloon.
- Have an animal race (you each mimic an animal's movement)
- Turn a sheet into a parachute and send nerf-like balls on a ride as you all move the sheet up and down quickly (don't drop the sheet until all have been bounced off OR choose one child to be the "retriever" during the round and toss the balls back on the sheet)
- Design your own indoor tag game (I use a piece of a pool noodle as a "soft tagger"): tickle-tag, flag-tag (tuck a washcloth or dish towel on each side of your waistband), or freeze tag (you hold a pose for 5-10 seconds before getting back into the game.
- Invite your children to create or suggest other safe movement activities that can be enjoyed by all.
